



UTS Scholarship Conditions of Award

UTS Onshore Postgraduate International Scholarship

This document sets out the conditions of award for the below scholarship ('Scholarship') as well as the obligations of recipients ('Recipient') and the University of Technology Sydney ('UTS') in regards to this Scholarship. The administrative processes to support awarding this Scholarship will be managed, and may be amended, in accordance with UTS Rules, Policy and Procedures.

1. SCHOLARSHIP NAME: UTS Onshore Postgraduate International Scholarship

2. PURPOSE

To attract commencing international students already in Australia to enroll in a postgraduate coursework program at UTS.

3. VALUE AND BENEFIT

3.1 Number of Recipients

The annual number of Recipients will vary and is determined by the following variables:

- a) the availability of funding; and
- b) the number of eligible candidates

3.2 Benefit/s to Recipient

- UTS will pay for 25% of each Recipient's UTS tuition fees for the course enrolled in for the duration of the Scholarship as defined in clause 4.
- The Scholarship cannot be transferred, deferred or redeemed for cash.

3.3 Payment of Benefit/s

- The tuition fee contributions will be made directly to the Recipient's UTS fees account each session for the duration of the Scholarship as defined in clause 4.
- The tuition fee contributions are subject to the Recipient satisfying ongoing eligibility criteria as defined in clause 8.

4. DURATION

The duration of the Scholarship is the standard number of credit points required for completion of the Recipient's enrolled postgraduate coursework program up to maximum four (4) sessions under any program. This is on the basis of a full-time study load, as specified in the letter of offer for admission to the course. Where the Recipient does not follow the usual standard full-time course structure, the total value of the Scholarship may be exhausted prior to course completion.

5. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible for the Scholarship, an applicant must meet all of the following criteria:

- Must be an international student (not an Australian citizen, New Zealand citizen or permanent resident of Australia); and
- Must be a citizen from a country in the South Asia, South East Asia or Africa region; and
- Must have completed a recognised Australian tertiary qualification at a Bachelor degree level or higher; and

- Must meet all admission criteria for the selected Master by coursework program; and
- Must be commencing studies at UTS full-time and on campus¹; and
- Must not:
 - be studying a UTS online degree or distance mode degree; or
 - be a recipient of other UTS international scholarships or grants; or
 - the UTS Alumni Advantage Program for the duration of this Scholarship; and
 - be a government sponsored student.

6. RECIPIENT SELECTION CRITERIA

Academic merit in the most recently completed Australian tertiary qualification at a Bachelor degree level or higher and recognised by UTS for entry into the selected UTS Master by coursework program.

7. SELECTION

UTS Future Learner Recruitment and Admissions will automatically consider all commencing international students applying for a Master degree by coursework program at UTS in Sydney for this Scholarship. There is no separate scholarship application or documentation in addition to what is required for the coursework application.

Offers will be authorized by Deputy Head, Admission Services and Scholarships, UTS Future Learner Recruitment and Admissions.

8. ONGOING RECIPIENT ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

8.1 Academic progress:

The Recipient must achieve a minimum Pass average (WAM 50+) in each session. Where the pass average is not achieved, payment of the Scholarship may be suspended or terminated, unless the Recipient can demonstrate exceptional circumstances² for the consideration of the Scholarship Selection Committee.

8.2 UTS Enrolment:

- The recipient must continue to be enrolled as a full-time international student (minimum 48 Credit Points per year, usually 24 Credit Points in Autumn and Spring session) in the eligible UTS program for the duration of the Scholarship, unless they has been approved to study a reduced study load through the standard International Student Visa Holders Application to Reduce Study Load application process through a UTS Student Centre.
- The Scholarship is not transferrable to another UTS course.

8.3 Leave / Deferral / Course Withdrawal:

- All deferral or suspension requests are subject to approval from UTS.
- If the Recipient defers the UTS offer or withdraws from the UTS course after the start of their first session and before the census date, the Scholarship will be terminated and any tuition fees paid will be refunded according to the [Statement of protocol on fees and refunds for international students studying in Australia](#).
- After the first session, if the Recipient can demonstrate exceptional circumstances², they may apply to the Selection Committee via UTS Scholarships for a temporary suspension of the Scholarship during the period of approved leave. If a period of leave is approved, the Scholarship will be suspended for duration of the approved leave period. However, the Scholarship will be terminated if the Recipient takes leave without approval from UTS Scholarships or does not submit a request to retain application to take an approved leave of absence for the scholarship.

8.4 Academic Integrity:

- UTS takes Academic Integrity very seriously and breaches (e.g. plagiarism, cheating, etc.) are considered Academic Misconduct. For more information on Academic Integrity at UTS can be found on the [UTS Current Students pages](#) of the UTS website.

¹ On campus studies include face-to-face and/or online (remote) learning in all degrees except online degrees and distance mode degrees.

² Exceptional circumstances may include, but are not limited to, disability, ongoing illness, carer's responsibilities and other educational barriers, and are considered on a case-by-case basis.

- Any Academic Misconduct allegations proven by the University (and upheld if appealed) may result in the termination of this Scholarship and the University might require the Recipient to repay the total benefit received at time of termination.

8.5 Other obligations and conditions

- The offer of the Scholarship is made subject to information provided by the Recipient being true and accurate.
- By accepting the offer of the Scholarship, each Recipient agrees to the Conditions of Award.
- Recipients must comply with all of UTS' rules, policies and procedures including those relating to conduct.
- The Recipient is responsible for advising UTS Scholarships Office of any changes in circumstances that would make them ineligible for continuation of the Scholarship, including but not limited to taking Leave of Absence or deferring study, changing their international student visa status to other visa categories, including but not limited to Permanent Residency visa.
- If the Recipient obtains Permanent Residency status, the Scholarship will be terminated as outlined below:
 - For Recipients obtaining Permanent Residency before census date in any session, the Scholarship will be terminated and any Scholarship payment already made for that session will be reversed.
 - For Recipients obtaining their Permanent Residency after census date in any session: the Scholarship will be terminated the following session.
- The Recipient will be responsible for any study costs incurred outside UTS tuition fees, including payment of the Student Services and Amenities Fee.
- Any change to the Recipient's circumstances not addressed by these Conditions of Award will be considered by UTS Scholarships and/or Scholarship Selection Committee on a case-by-case.
- The Recipient does not need to re-apply for the Scholarship each year.
- The Recipient is not permitted to hold other UTS Scholarships or Grants or the Alumni Advantage Program for the duration of the Scholarship.
- The recipient may be invited to consent to allowing their name, photograph and/or short article to be used for the promotion of UTS.

9. TERMINATION OF RECIPIENT'S SCHOLARSHIP

The Scholarship may be terminated:

- If the Recipient ceases to meet the eligibility criteria; or
- If the Recipient breaches any conditions of the Scholarship; or
- If UTS determines that the student is guilty of misconduct and after consultation with the Director, Student Administration, the delegate able to award the Scholarship deems that it is not appropriate for the Recipient to continue to hold the Scholarship.
- If the scholarship is terminated due to breaching any conditions or misconduct, the Recipient may be required to reimburse UTS for any scholarship payments already made.
