Current School Leaver Selection

For the Bachelor of Accounting (UAC Code 601010) current school leaver applicants are required to submit a **compulsory Bachelor of Accounting Application Questionnaire**, in addition to the UAC application form, and may also be required to attend an interview. Selection is on the basis of Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) together with additional information obtained through the compulsory questionnaire and interview.

Non Current School Leaver Selection

The Bachelor of Accounting is intended for current school leavers. Very few non-current school leavers are admitted to the Bachelor of Accounting.

For the Bachelor of Accounting (UAC Code 601010) applicants are required to submit a **compulsory Bachelor of Accounting Application Questionnaire**, in addition to the UAC application form, and may also be required to attend an interview.

Selection is on the basis of academic merit together with additional information obtained through the compulsory questionnaire and interview. Academic merit is determined on the basis of any qualifications listed below in the section "Qualifications Used in Selection".

Qualifications Used in Selection

The following qualifications are considered for admission into the Bachelor of Accounting.

Australian and New Zealand Secondary Qualifications

Any completed State Senior Certificate is accepted. For example:

- New South Wales Higher School Certificate
- ACT Year 12 Certificate
- Queensland Senior Examination
- South Australian Certificate of Education
- Tasmanian Certificate of Education
- Victorian Certificate of Education
- Western Australian Year 12
- New Zealand National Certificate in Educational Achievement (NCEA Level 3)

Limited ATAR

The Faculty of Business will consider a completed Limited ATAR. If you are using the Limited ATAR as the basis of admission, you must be over 20 years of age on 1 March 2011 **and** submit a personal statement directly to UTS.

The International Baccalaureate

The completed International Baccalaureate (IB) is considered for all undergraduate Business courses.
