Your program options

We offer a variety of study abroad and exchange options, from full-time English language courses to coursework programs of one or two teaching sessions.

Option 01

Student exchange

- open to eligible students who are enrolled at an official UTS exchange partner institution
- enrol in full-time studies and gain credit at UTS for one or two teaching sessions with the approval of your home university
- you are not required to pay tuition fees to UTS, but may still have to pay regular fees at your home university

- open to students from any recognised university, or high school (conditions apply)

Study Abroad 18 offers you the chance to study a **reduced number of credit points** (18 per teaching session rather than the usual 24) and **pay a lower tuition fee.**

Option O3

Australian language and culture studies

- open to students who do not meet the required English language level to enrol in other UTS study abroad and exchange programs*
- allows you to complete full-time studies to develop your English language skills through the study of Australian language, society and culture
- students who enrol in this program for two teaching sessions may choose to take an IELTS test at the end of their first session to see if they are eligible to transfer into a different study abroad or exchange option for their second session





Australian Language and Culture Studies

Develop your English language skills and learn about our beautiful country at the same time. Australian Language and Culture Studies (ALACS) at UTS is the ideal program to master your English and enhance your knowledge of Australia. The program consists of three subjects per teaching session.

Once you've improved your language skills in class, you can take an English language test. If your test results meet the UTS English Proficiency Requirements, you can transfer into other study abroad or exchange programs the following session.

Credit, classes and assessment

Classes, assessment, credit transfer

As a study abroad or exchange student, you must enrol in a full-time study load of 18-24 credit points per teaching session. Credit points apply to all subjects and represent a measure of the student's workload by subject. Most subjects at UTS are six (6) credit points each, except some offered by the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences, which are eight (8) credit points.

The table below is a guide to the equivalent number of credit points at UTS with your home country.

Pre-enrol before you arrive

Subjects approved by UTS are added to your session's study plan. Once they have been added, you can enrol yourself in 18 to 24 credit points before you leave home.

UTS learning and teaching style

Most UTS subjects are taught through a mix of lectures and tutorials, seminars or laboratory sessions and require a minimum 12 to 24 hours' study per week.

Class sizes vary depending on the popularity of the subject and the nature of teaching.

Typically, subjects involving tutorial classes have 20 to 30 students in a classroom.

Academic transcripts

The academic transcript is a record of subjects studied, final grades and marks awarded. UTS issues digital transcripts through the MyEquals platform at the end of each teaching session, once the exam results have been finalised.

Academic year and key dates

The academic year at UTS is divided into three teaching sessions (see table below). There is no intake in the summer session for Study Abroad and Exchange students.

Entry requirements

Academic requirements - current university students

You must have completed one full year or more of study at a recognised institution with the following or equivalent grades:

- a 'credit' or 'good' average, or
- a cumulative GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 point scale, or
- an average grade of 'C' or better on the European ECTS grading scale.

Academic requirements - high school graduates

If you have not yet completed one year of fulltime study at a recognised institution you may apply for admission as a study abroad student if you meet university matriculation requirements and are over 18 years of age. Conditions may apply regarding subject access.

Selection is based on academic excellence in the most recently completed tertiary qualification recognised by UTS for entry in the Study Abroad program. We also offer mobility grants to eligible students from UTS Study Abroad partner institutions.

Housing and accommodation

Secure a room in UTS Housing or get information and assistance on a range of private accommodation options.

Accommodation on campus

UTS's student housing is called Yura Mudang. It's self-catered, secure and competitively priced. The building has spacious communal and barbecue areas, study rooms, as well as a games room, computer room and music room. Managed by the UTS Housing Service, the residence is for UTS students only and offers studio and shared-apartment types. Apartments are fully furnished but you will need to provide your own linen and some cooking equipment.

Independent accommodation

Looking for private accommodation? We recommend getting started with some short-term accommodation in Sydney, so you can check out properties in person and choose

something that suits your long-term needs.

Don't pay any money before viewing and being satisfied with a non-UTS property. Until you arrive and get a feel for the area you want to live in, you won't know whether it is right for you.

Establishment costs

At UTS Housing, rent includes gas, electricity, water, cabled internet in bedrooms and wireless internet in communal areas. You'll need to budget for the application fee (A\$50), the acceptance fee (A\$150), the bond (equivalent of four weeks rent), two weeks rent in advance, and any personal items, such as bed linen and some cooking equipment. Licence fees are different for each type.

UTS priority housing placement

UTS Housing offers a limited number (150) of beds exclusively for exchange and study abroad students. You must apply early as applications are on a first-come-first-served


