

How to check if your address meets the socio-economic eligibility criteria

To find out whether your address is in an area that meets the socio-economic eligibility criteria for UniReady, follow the steps below using the official SEIFA interactive map.

UniReady defines low socio-economic status (SES) as being located in a Statistical Area Level 1 (SA1) that falls within the bottom two IRSAD SEIFA quintiles. This corresponds to SEIFA Quintile 1 or 2, or a SEIFA Percentile of 40 or below.

Step-by-step guide

- 1. Open the SEIFA IRSAD interactive map linked here.
- 2. At the top of the page, make sure the IRSAD tab is selected.

 This shows data from the Index of Relative Socio-economic Advantage and Disadvantage.
- 3. On the left-hand panel, scroll down to the list of map layers.
 - Ensure only "Statistical Area Level 1 (SA1)" is turned on (eye icon should be visible).
 - Turn off all other layers (such as SA2, LGA, or POA).
- 4. In the search bar at the top right:
 - Click the dropdown menu icon (a list symbol).
 - Untick all options except "Address search".
- 5. Type your full address, including suburb and postcode, and select the correct option from the list.
- 6. The map will zoom to your area. Click anywhere within the coloured boundary surrounding your address.
- 7. A pop-up box will appear showing the SEIFA information for your SA1.
 - Look for the SEIFA Quintile or SEIFA Percentile.
 - If your area is in SEIFA Quintile 1 or 2, or the SEIFA Percentile is 40 or below, your address meets the socio-economic eligibility for UniReady.


Example

If you search for 150 Dobell Road, Claymore NSW 2559, the map will show a SEIFA Percentile of 1, which means the area is in the lowest quintile.


