Strategic Alignment	Proposed research must align with University of Technology Research Strategy. Relationship between proposed research area and current research activities of staff; internal resource availability (such as space); equity considerations and potential impact of the proposed research
Risk Assessment	Proposed research must not fall within research areas and affiliations and/or collaborative institutions considered to be high risk for the University
Expression of Interest	Quality and potential of EoI or Research Proposal
Objective Evaluations	Evidence provided by external references (written and numerical), experience of the referees, including experience as supervisors, qualifications, seniority, and direct knowledge of the research experience of the candidate
