Applicants are required to have current registration as a nurse and secure concurrent midwifery employment as a midwifery student in an accredited midwifery unit.

This can be done through the NSW Ministry of Health, Nursing and Midwifery Office using the MidSTART process or by applying directly to NSW private hospitals or maternity providers.
