

Indicative Study Plan Templates – Bachelor of Global Studies 2017

Below you will find indicative study plans for each of the majors in Global Studies. Before you begin, please remember some basic principles.

- If you intend to study overseas during a UTS teaching session, you should follow the study plan with the exchange option; it is easier to modify one's study plan to account for staying in Sydney than to reconfigure it to allow for three electives to be taken in one session.
- If you scored in band 1 on the OPELA test that you undertook during orientation and preparation weeks, you are strongly advised to take 59721 Academic English: Communication Fundamentals as soon as you can, preferably at the same time as Global Histories. This subject is designed to strengthen your capacities in academic literacy at a university level and should allow you to navigate both the subjects you undertake concurrently and subsequently with greater ease. This subject is offered in all three academic sessions (autumn, spring, summer) so if you are advised at a later date by a subject coordinator or tutor that you might benefit from further Academic English study, you may submit an e-request to add it to your study plan for another session.
- If you study 59721 Academic English: Communication Fundamentals, you may not be able to complete a full sub major (which requires 3 x 8cp subjects), however, you may still opt to study two of the subjects in a sub major as electives.
- These indicative study plans only cover the Autumn and Spring sessions and don't necessarily account for any subjects you may undertake during the summer session or as an International Intensive subject in either summer or July term. There may be the opportunity to undertake studies in your major or to complete electives, including Academic English, outside of the main teaching periods. Summer/July study can lighten your load during particularly 'heavy' sessions, allow you to make up a subject that you might have failed or in some cases to graduate earlier.
- 97900 International Internship may be substituted for 99205 Global Work Project. You must submit an e-request to apply for the International Internship and upon successful completion of the subject, submit an e-request to have it counted as a core subject in their degree. It is still possible to complete both the domestic and the international internships, the latter as an elective.
- If you are an international student, you may occasionally need to apply to have a reduced study load approved for sessions in which you are not undertaking 24cp. This should not be a problem, as the Global Studies study plans regularly feature "over and under" sessions if you are undertaking a professional major other than Communications. You should apply for reduced study load at UTS:International.
- These study plans provide options and a sample way through the program. You may also consider alternate pathways, especially in the Business and Management Studies majors, as most subjects are offered in all three sessions (autumn, spring, summer). In seeking to vary your study plan, be sure to seek advice from either the student centre or from the Course Coordinator.

1. It is best to start the Communication major in 1st session 1st year because of the prerequisites within the Communication major.
2. Students who score in band 1 of the OPELA test are strongly encouraged to complete 59721 Academic English: Communication Fundamentals concurrently with Global Histories. This 8cp subject is an approved elective.
3. These examples are indicative only, because there are many possible options within the Global Studies degree. The arrangement of subjects by session may change according to the majors and sub majors chosen.

Notes:

1. The recommended sequence for the Business Studies Major is for students to take 26100: Integrating Business Perspectives as their first subject as it provides the overall introduction to the business landscape. The rest of the subjects are arranged according to difficulty and workload so it is best to follow the recommended sequence to balance students' study loads.

The reason for making 26100 a pre-requisite is to allow students to re-enrol in this subject immediately for the next session should they fail 26100.

2. Students who score in band 1 of the OPELA test are strongly encouraged to complete 59721 Academic English: Communication Fundamentals concurrently with Global Histories if they are not planning an exchange session. This 8cp subject is an approved elective. Depending on whether an exchange is planned, students completing 59721 Academic English: Communication Fundamentals may need to rearrange the order of their business subjects to take full advantage of the supports offered in the Academic English subject.
3. Core subjects in Business have about 1100 students each, with a two-hour lecture and 1 hour tutorial, and most of the tutors are 'external' (not familiar with UTS systems). Such large classes mean that there is less pastoral care for students than what you might expect in a smaller degree program like Global Studies.
4. Because the numbers are so large subjects are offered each session, which makes flexibility easier.
5. Business students have priority in choosing tutorial times for the large subjects. Enrolment options will become available to Global Studies students later (see either the Building 5 or Building 10 Student Centres for exact dates) so Global Studies students may not be able to choose the class times they prefer, although since there are many classes they should find class times that do not clash with other classes.
6. Business subjects have the U:PASS system of peer assisted extra classes which can help students who are struggling with the subjects <http://www.ssu.uts.edu.au/peerlearning/about.html> .

Notes:

1. It is important to note that nearly all of the subjects offered in the Management Studies major are second year level. Students who have never studied Commerce or Management as a discipline before may struggle in this major. The Business Studies Major may be a better option for students without this background who nonetheless wish to have a business-oriented major as part of their degree.
2. Management subjects have smaller numbers of students than Business subjects, so not all of them are offered every session, but all should be offered at least once a year.

Notes:

1. The Legal Studies major has quite a lot of flexibility so these study plans are only two of several ways students might progress.
2. Introduction to Law must be taken before any of the others are taken. It is a pre-requisite for Public International Law, which is in turn a co- or pre-requisite for all other law subjects.
3. Public International Law is often offered in both Autumn and Spring sessions. Students who wish to complete a sequential sub-major (such as a Language Other Than English) may wish to undertake Public International Law in Y2/S1 and do the second of their submajor subjects in Y1/S2. This, however, could mean requiring the even more of one's law subjects to be taken in the final year of study when availability may be limited.
4. Students who score in band 1 of the OPELA test are strongly encouraged to complete 59721 Academic English: Communication Fundamentals concurrently with Global Histories. This 8cp subject is an approved elective.
5. Not all of the elective Law subjects (which are taken after Introduction to Law and after/concurrently with Public International Law) are offered every session or even every year. Some are offered in summer sessions, some are taught only in intensive mode (eg, over four Saturdays). Please endeavour to be flexible about your choices. If you are set on a particular subject, try to take it at the first possible opportunity, as it may not be available again during your time as a student.

Notes:

1. Students are required to undertake 92574 Introduction to Public Health, 92571 Principles of Primary Health Care and 92566 Introduction to Health Care Systems early in their degree, as the remainder of the Health Studies subjects list them as either pre-requisites or co-requisites.
2. 92569 Fundamentals of Epidemiology and Population Health is a requisite for 92483 Epidemiology and Global Population Health. Students who are electing a session-long exchange will not have the option of completing 92483 Epidemiology and Global Population Health because they will not have time to complete the necessary requisite subject and will therefore have to select from among the other subject offerings.
3. Health studies subjects are offered either in the autumn or spring sessions (not both) so deviations from your study plan must be made with this limitation in mind.
4. Students who go on exchange must undertake 28cp (one Global Studies core subject, one sub major/elective subject and 2 Health Studies subjects) in either the autumn or the spring session, although they may choose in which session to undertake the heavier load. (Satisfying the work-integrated learning requirement via the International Internship subject may make Spring the preferable option, as students would then only need to undertake 20cp that session).
