Study Abroad and Exchange at UTS: Education

As a Study Abroad or Exchange Student, you may design a program of subjects from more than one faculty at UTS, provided you enrol in 18-24 credit points of full-time study. Education subjects are 6 credit points each. Subjects offered in other faculties may carry different credit point values.

When can I study?

The UTS Academic Year operates on two separate calendars, **Calendar A** and **Calendar B**. Most faculties offer all subjects within Calendar A only. The UTS School of Education offers subjects in both calendars. Study Abroad and Exchange Students must choose one calendar and select all their subjects within that one calendar. To decide which calendar to choose your subjects from, please see the two options below:

1. If you are not an Education student at your home University but you would like to take some subjects from the School of Education while at UTS, you may select subjects from [Calendar A](#) only.
2. If you are an Education Major Student at your home University, you must select all your UTS subjects from [Calendar B](#).
 - **Calendar B Autumn Session 2017 (February – July)**
Orientation begins Monday, 20 February 2017. The Session end date will be 30 June 2017 for Education Major Students (the same as all Exchange and Study Abroad students)
 - **Calendar B Spring Session 2017 (July – December)**
Orientation begins Monday 24 July 2017 (the same as all Exchange and Study Abroad students). The Session end date for Education Major Students will be 1 December 2017.

Please note:

- If you apply for a subject with one or more prerequisites, you will need to demonstrate that you have the prior skills and knowledge necessary to undertake the subject.
- Subjects within the School of Education are often only offered once a year. Please check the timetable in case of a change.
- Undergraduate students are generally not permitted to enrol in postgraduate subjects.

- **L1** (Level 1) Usually undertaken in first year (similar to 100 level, introductory level)
- **L2** (Level 2) Usually undertaken in second year (similar to 200 level, prior knowledge is required)
- **L3** (Level 3) Usually undertaken in third year (similar to 300 level, advanced level)
