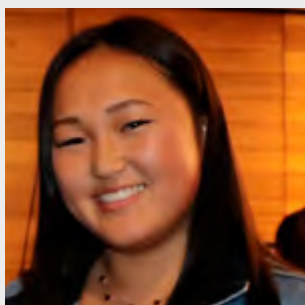

The availability of leading experts in the field of robotics path planning at UTS, which was my intended field of study meant I would be able to work

alongside passionate researchers and get positive as well of useful supervision for my PhD. The work that Professor Robert Fitch and his active perception lab were doing in underwater robotics was interesting and ultimately motivated me to apply to UTS.

Research area and potential of my research?

I am working in active perception for mobile robotics, specifically working on trajectory generation for sensor calibration. The goal is to come up with a framework that generates the most informative trajectories that can be used for calibrating any additional sensors that are added to a robotic platform while it is moving in the least amount of time.

What scholarship did you receive and how has it helped you with your research journey?

Being a recipient of both the Faculty of Engineering and Information Technology scholarship and the International Research Scholarship helped me have a smooth transition when I moved to Australia. It also allows me to focus my undivided attention on my research work without worrying about paying for tuition or the cost of living in Australia.

“I began my career as an apprentice draftsman with a civil engineering consultancy, which involved undertaking a diploma at TAFE. Once I completed it, I was able to apply to UTS and received a year’s worth of exemptions. UTS tends to cater better for working professionals, both in the subject timetable and geographic location. Plus, Construction Project Management students seem to find work quite quickly: the majority of my classmates have cadetships by year two or three. Because of this you can begin growing your professional network quite early on. Students in the course also earn a pretty decent wage when compared to the internships in architecture or engineering. Plus studying with others working in the industry, and hearing about their work experiences, is very inspiring.

In 2015 I received the Hansen Yuncken Scholarship, which was a huge accomplishment considering it was my first year at uni. They’ve also offered me a cadetship, which I am looking forward to commencing once I have progressed through the course a bit more.”

Alison Whittaker, a Gomeroi woman from Gunnedah in NSW, became a Fulbright Scholar at the prestigious Harvard University to aid her research on sentencing reform for Indigenous women, and is now a published poet. In the beginning, however, she only had \$600 to her name, no income stream, and was not sure how she would balance work and study. It was then that she applied for and was awarded the inaugural Law Equity Scholarship at UTS.

“We all did a dance around the house. It was such a relief. My life would have been very different had I not received the Law Equity Scholarship”. Alison believes that she couldn’t have achieved everything she’s done without it, including graduating with first class honours. During her time at UTS: Law she set-up the Indigenous Collective which provides support and advice to Indigenous students on campus. This is when she realised the importance of the balance between law and her Aboriginal community. “The UTS Law Equity Scholarship made my undergraduate study possible, for one. It bought essentials for study and living in the first four years of my undergraduate coursework.”

- Scholarships and grants are available to high-achieving UTS Insearch Diploma graduates starting at UTS.
- Study Abroad Excellence Awards for commencing Study Abroad students coming to UTS as part of their home degree.

Government and externally funded scholarships and loans are also available to incoming international students.

Scholarships and grants for international students are also available for study in certain faculties.

UTS Global Exchange

The UTS Global Exchange program allows students to study overseas for one or two teaching sessions at a UTS partner university. With over 240 exchange partners in over 40 countries and territories, UTS has one of the largest international exchange programs in Australia.

UTS and the Australian Government offer scholarships and grants to help cover some of the costs associated with overseas study. Additional funding options are available for students who undertake studies in Asia and the Indo-Pacific.

UTS Scholarships and Grants:

- Dr Chau Chak Wing Scholarships – offer students the opportunity to undertake one session of study at a university in China with a one-off payment of \$10,000.
- UTS Global Exchange grants of \$1,000 – assist students with some of the costs of going on exchange.

Australian Government Scholarships and Grants:

- New Colombo Plan Scholarship program – a life-changing scholarship opportunity of up to \$69,000 for high-calibre UTS undergraduate students to undertake a session or two of study and an internship in the Indo-Pacific region.
- New Colombo Plan Mobility Grants – grants of up to \$7,000 to study in the Indo-Pacific region for a session.
- Australia Awards Endeavour Mobility Grants – grants of up to \$5,000 for students to undertake projects and study experiences overseas for up to a session.
- Endeavour Cheung Kong Student Exchange Program – supports undergraduate students from Australia and Asia with grants of \$5,000 to study in each other's home countries.

UTS BUILD travel grants

BUILD (Beyond UTS International Leadership Development) is a program that helps students develop their leadership potential and skills through a range of local and global opportunities.

Each university session break, in collaboration with Faculty and UTS International partners, BUILD Abroad offers students the opportunity to travel overseas on short term experiences to broaden their horizons, enhance their employability and become true global citizens. Opportunities include:

- Summer and Winter schools at partner universities
- Experiential learning programs with social enterprises
- International internships
- Faculty-led programs

UTS BUILD has a number of scholarships and grants for undergraduate students to supplement personal savings and cover some of the associated travelling costs of their short term experience.

UTS Scholarship and Grants:

- UTS BUILD Travel Scholarships – available for eligible local and international undergraduate students vary from \$500 - \$1,000
- Dr Chau Chak Wing Scholarships – available for eligible local undergraduate students to expand their knowledge and promote lifelong relationships between Australia and China. Successful recipients receive a \$2,000 Scholarship and become members of the prestigious alumni network known as the Dr Chau Chak Wing Scholars Network
- BUILD Equity and Diversity Scholarships – available for eligible students who are experiencing financial hardship and due to their financial situation would not otherwise have the opportunity to travel overseas on a BUILD Abroad Program.

Australian Government Scholarships:

- New Colombo Plan Mobility Grants – available for eligible Australian undergraduate students up to \$3,000 to study in the Indo-Pacific Region. These grants are specific to nominated BUILD or Faculty-led programs.

FAQs

WHICH SCHOLARSHIPS AM I ELIGIBLE FOR?

To determine whether you can apply for a particular scholarship, you need to consider your individual circumstances against the specific eligibility criteria of the scholarship.

Key eligibility criteria to look for are:

- Commencing or continuing student?
- Your Faculty and/or course?
- Undergraduate or postgraduate?
- Academic merit (see below)?
- Do you meet any of our equity criteria (see below)?
- Indigenous Australian?
- Elite athlete?

ACADEMIC MERIT

For future students – this is determined based on your high school results (ATAR or equivalent), or if applicable, results from prior studies at TAFE or an undergraduate degree at another institution.

For continuing students – this is determined based on the results obtained so far in subjects from your current degree at UTS.

EQUITY CRITERIA

Scholarships with an equity component are for students who may be encountering additional challenges in accessing tertiary education or who are experiencing other educational barriers which make it difficult to succeed at university.

Equity criteria can include:

- Students experiencing financial hardship*
- New students relocating from a regional or remote area
- Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander students
- Students from a refugee background
- Students with a long term disabilities or medical conditions
- Sole parents and carers

It is important to note that for many equity-based scholarships you are required to submit an Equity Scholarship application through the Universities Admissions Centre (UAC). It is a free online application which will allow you to be considered for all applicable UTS Equity Scholarships, and can be completed at any time prior to the UTS Scholarship closing date.

*As a rough guide, you are considered to be experiencing financial hardship if you are receiving a means -tested income support payment via Centrelink.

DO I NEED TO APPLY?

In most cases, yes you will need to submit a written application to be considered for a scholarship. However, for a small number of scholarships, Recipients are selected based on student data, such as your ATAR.

When an application form is optional, we highly recommend submitting the scholarship application to give yourself a competitive edge.

HOW DO I APPLY?

Most UTS Scholarships have a written online application form on our website which can be completed in your own time from home. Some scholarships require you to complete more than one form, and if you are applying for an equity-based scholarship you will need to also apply for a UAC Equity Scholarship.

WHEN DO SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS OPEN/CLOSE?

Scholarship opportunities will open and close throughout the year depending on availability and the academic calendar.

ARE SCHOLARSHIPS DEPENDENT ON ADMISSION TO A SPECIFIC COURSE?

Scholarships are either university-wide, meaning that you can study under any faculty at the University, or can be course-specific and require admission to a specific course or discipline (e.g. mechanical engineering, physics, law).

You can only be considered for course-specific scholarships if you have either the relevant UAC course application (for future students) or are studying the relevant course or discipline (for current students). It is also important to check if you are required to continue studying in a specific course area to continue receiving payments, or if course transfers are allowed.

HOW WILL I FIND OUT IF I HAVE BEEN AWARDED A SCHOLARSHIP?

If you have applied for a scholarship, either UAC or the UTS Scholarships Office will contact you to advise you of the outcome. Applicants will be notified after the selection process has been completed, generally 4–6 weeks from the time of the application closing date.

IF I AM OFFERED A SCHOLARSHIP, CAN I DEFER IT?

Unfortunately, unlike a course offer, scholarship offers cannot be deferred. However, if you would like to take a gap year or have planned leave from your studies you may be able to apply in the following application round. Check your scholarship for more details.

HOW DO I KEEP RECEIVING MY SCHOLARSHIP?

Nearly all scholarships have strict ongoing eligibility requirements, often related to maintaining a full-time study load and maintaining a certain academic standard.

All information regarding your scholarship is available in the Conditions of Award provided to you in your Letter of Offer. If your study circumstances change, please contact the Scholarships Office for further advice.

CAN I HOLD MORE THAN ONE SCHOLARSHIP SIMULTANEOUSLY?

Refer to the specific Condition of Award for the Scholarship for further information regarding this. Preference may be given to students not in receipt of other scholarships to help ensure that we support as many students as possible.

WHAT IF I AM UNSUCCESSFUL IN OBTAINING A SCHOLARSHIP?

Scholarships can be extremely competitive.

If you are unsuccessful for a scholarship, there are also plenty of opportunities for current students at UTS. You can apply for scholarships throughout your studies depending on what stage you are at in your degree. Current student scholarships include travel opportunities and internships to enhance your learning experience at UTS.

WHAT OTHER TYPE OF SUPPORT IS AVAILABLE FOR ME AT UTS?

UTS provides a range of support services to students, including those with a range of equity issues. Services include: health service, counselling, financial assistance, and accessibility service. More information can be found on the UTS website at: uts.edu.au/current-students/support

WILL MY SCHOLARSHIP BE TAXED?

UTS does not withhold PAYG tax from coursework scholarship or award payments. It is the Recipient's responsibility to check with the Australian Tax Office (ATO) and/or an independent tax adviser to ascertain whether payments received are classified as taxable income.
