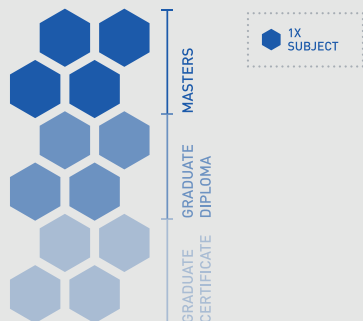

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ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- **Qualifications:** Bachelor's degree (or equivalent or higher qualification), or evidence of general and professional qualifications that demonstrates potential to pursue graduate studies. Previous qualifications must be in a health-related field such as nursing, allied health or medicine.
- **Registration:** current registration in Australia for one of the following: Nurse (RN or Division 1), Midwife, Accredited Practising Dietitian, Medical Practitioner, Pharmacist, Dietitian, Podiatrist, Accredited Exercise Physiologist, Physiotherapist, Psychologist, Aboriginal Health Practitioner.
- **Experience:** It is assumed that applicants have a basic knowledge of the practice of diabetes education and management. A minimum of one year exposure or experience in diabetes education is highly desirable.
