The 'price' analysis will be done on the past Calendar Year's consumption profile. Consumption charges, fixed / supply charges and other charges will be added to obtain a total retail cost.

3.3.3 Acceptance or Rejection of Tenders

- a) The University may assess an Alternative Tender against the Tender Evaluation Criteria if submitted with a Conforming Tender.
- b) The University expressly reserves the right to accept, in its discretion, either or both of the following:
 - a. Any Alternative Tender or part of an Alternative Tender, where submitted with a Conforming Tender; and
 - b. Any other Non-Conforming Tender or part of a Non-Conforming Tender (not, in either case, being an Alternative Tender or part of an Alternative Tender) that, in the University's opinion is substantially a Conforming Tender.
 - c. The University is not bound to accept the lowest priced tender.
