## What's the course workload like?

Most full-time Fashion & Textiles students spend 3-4 days per week at uni. Students are expected to complete work outside of their contact hours to prepare for class tutorials and assessments.

## Are there assignments and exams?

- This course has ongoing assessment tasks including design studio tasks in construction, drape, and textiles
- Combination of written and visual assignments
- No exams

## What will I learn from this course?

Throughout their studies, students learn about 2D and 3D pattern making approaches, conceptual thinking, experimental design, fashion design practice, fashion history, fashion research, global fashion studios, menswear, sustainable fashion, textile design practice, womenswear.

Students must complete 144 credit points made up of:

- 108 credit points of **core subjects**
- 24 credit points of **design studies**
- 12 credit points of **electives**

## What is the difference between Bachelor & Honours?

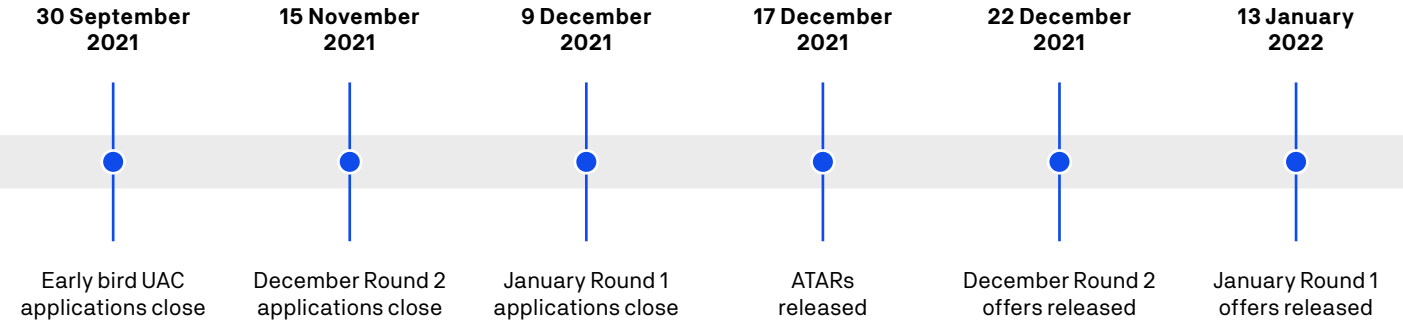
# Applying for this course

### How much does this course cost?

UTS students pay **tuition fees** to contribute towards the costs of their studies. Given the nature of this course, there are also additional costs for materials and equipment (\$200–\$500 per semester). For further information regarding fees, you can use our **tuition fee search**.

### Am I eligible for Adjustment Factors for this course (previously known as Year 12 Bonus Points)?

Students are eligible for a maximum of 5 adjustment factors. You can view which HSC subjects currently have adjustment factors for this course **here**.

### What are my options if I don't get the necessary Selection Ranking/ATAR?

Alternative **admissions pathways** into our courses are available. These **pathways** use alternative criteria to gain entry into a course. The Faculty of Design, Architecture and Building also offers non-current school leavers the opportunity to **submit a Design Portfolio** to support their application.

### If I don't get accepted into this course, what are my options?

UTS College (formerly known as UTS INSEARCH) offers a **Diploma of Design & Architecture** which has a strong emphasis on practical design skills, creative thinking, and concept generation. Students who achieve a certain GPA (varies per course) at the completion of the Diploma are eligible to receive an offer into the Bachelor of Design in Fashion and Textiles. You will also receive **recognition of prior learning** towards your degree.

### I finished high school a few years ago, how can I get into this course?

**Non-current school leavers** can gain admission based on academic qualifications. Generally, the best qualification from the following is considered for non-current school leaver applications:

- HSC marks
- 1 year of study at another UTS course or another university
- Completed Diploma from TAFE or other college provider

### I have professional experience and/or previous study in this field, will that help me get in?

Previously completed study at other universities may be assessed for **Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)**; this is assessed on a case-by-case basis once your application has been submitted. Professional experience does not qualify towards Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) in the course.

### Are scholarships available?
