

What is the impact of enzyme replacement: A systematic review

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The problem

People diagnosed with **pancreatic cancer** face ...

- Dismal prognosis,
- Decreased quality of life
- Symptoms (1)
 - Pancreatic exocrine insufficiency (PEI)

PEI leads to

- Decreased enzyme production
- Abdominal pain
- Diarrhoea
- Significant weight loss (2)



The evidence

12 studies were included in the literature review. Four themes arose

- PERT education
- Efficacy of PERT
- Patient experience
- Lack of awareness

Evidence in literature demonstrates that PERT...

- improves weight loss
- symptoms
- relationship to food
- survival



The solution

PEI can be treated!

With pancreatic enzyme replacement therapy **(PERT)**


PERT

- Improves fat, protein and carbohydrate digestion.
- Has positive effects on quality of life (1)



The way forward

- Research funding
- Collaborative research network spanning Australia and New Zealand (ASPERT)
- Enhance community engagement.
- New Australasian study asking people with pancreatic cancer about PERT (see study pamphlet)
