



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

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Why Books?

- Books can be mirrors, windows and sliding doors for young people and help to facilitate conversations and deepen understandings. They are also perfect for unpacking complex subject matter.
- The saying 'a picture paints a thousand words' communicates how powerfully art can change the ways in which we see the world and books are an accessible work of art.
- Books provide a safe space to escape to when the actual world is just too 'noisy'. Books are the quietest of companions...there when you need their comfort but silent when you need space and solitude.



Mirrors, Windows, Sliding Doors

- A mirror is a story that reflects your life and helps build your identity. When young people see their lives reflected in books it helps them to feel less alone in the world.
- A window offers you a view into someone else's experience. In this case books as a way to develop empathy and understanding for the journey of a peer. Books can help to facilitate conversations and deepen understandings and are perfect for unpacking complex subject matter.
- The window may also become a sliding door and allow the reader to enter the story, walk in the shoes of another, reflect and take action.



Books as art

Art sparks interest, nurtures empathy and can have huge emotional impact.


The creatives behind books do something special with big issues, e.g. refugees seeking asylum. They use forms of writing (style, voice, structure, content, symbols) and illustrative style, content and innovation (colour, camera angles) to convey a message artistically.



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A Word on Reading aloud

- Models fluent and sustained reading
- Develops understanding of tone and expression
- Improves listening skills
- Develops skills around book conventions
- Shared reading and discussion promotes critical thinking and comprehension skills
- Read once, read twice, read again...
