

Learning options – Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, cultures and self

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This list is in response to the oft-asked question from UTS Faculty of Health staff *Do you know* any courses *I* could do or places *I* could go to learn more about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and cultures?

Here are some courses, websites and other resources. It's certainly a journey from learning information about self and others, to then be skilled in practices and work. It's almost impossible to make a link between learning more and then being able to create conditions for cultural safety and security in your workplace or work. Also, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures are diverse – it's a lifelong learning journey for all of us to learn about our many nations, cultures, models of health care and workforce needs.

One important strategy is learning to speak confidently about your own culture/s. Avoid saying you are 'non-Indigenous' and get confident naming *My cultural background and cultures are*... Also, find some fluency in naming *My relationship to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and culture is* ... because...

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures are relational – relationship based. Speaking openly about yourself/myself is key to relating. This requires critical self-reflection which is essential to cultural safety.

Ensure you participate in events and actions local to you that are led by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.
