

# Propose a new series

## Complete the Rapid new series proposal form.

Proposals made for new series will be considered at the next meeting of the IMPACCT Rapid Program Management Committee, which meets twice per year. Proposers of new ideas will be advised of the outcome within one week of the meeting.



Each series is governed by a subcommittee (up to 10 members) and a Chair is appointed at the commencement of the series. The Chair of the committee is often the proposer of the series. You may choose to have a co-chair.

Subcommittee members may be investigators at participating sites or clinicians with an interest or expertise in a particular series.

A call for an Expression of Interest to join the subcommittee will made by the IMPACCT Rapid Program team.



## 4 Subcommittee meetings

A data collection worksheet or Case Report Form (CRF) is drafted. Each subcommittee determines critical data collection items, including time points, anticipated possible harms/adverse events, and agreement of routine clinical practice elements.

At least two subcommittee meetings are held to facilitate the development of the series.



Once the CRF is finalised, an electronic survey will be **built on REDCap** by the IMPACCT Rapid Program team for data entry. This will then be tested and piloted by a few sites. Feedback and changes will be made based on pilot testing





# 7 Series closure

A series will close when data from 100 patients is collected, or at the discretion of the subcommittee if the series does not recruit within a prescribed



### 6 Series launch

Following the piloting of a few datasets and changes being finalised, the series will launch officially and be open to collection from all sites. An official email will be sent to all participating sites in the IMPACCT Rapid Program and series documents will be uploaded on the website.

### Analysis, write-up, and publication

Once the series is closed, members of the subcommittee will reconvene to begin data analysis and write up of the results paper. Members will be asked to be part of the series authorship team, subject to meeting criteria as documented in the ITCC Authorship Standard Operating Procedure.

The Chair usually takes the Executive Author role.
