

## RULE CHANGES APPROVED BY COUNCIL

Pursuant to the UTS By-law (Part 4, division 3, clause 44), the following rules have been made by UTS Council. They come into force on the day of effect of the amended University of Technology, Sydney, By-law, which is deemed to be the day the changes to the By-law are published on the NSW Legislation website.

At its meeting 13/5 on 14 August 2013, Council resolved to approve amendments to the Rules as follows:

.4 approve changes to the UTS Rules as a result of those changes being made to the By-law, as detailed in Attachment 6, with a date of effect as outlined.

Attachment 1 details the new and amended Rules as follows:

## **UTS General Rules**

G1 — Rules relating to Council, the Chancellor, Deputy Chancellor and Vice-Chancellor

## 20. Authority for determining the method of election

For the purposes of by-law 15A of the UTS By-Law, the Registrar, as Returning Officer, will determine for each Council election, whether that election is conducted using an electronic or non-electronic voting system.

# G2 — Rules on election of Chancellor and Deputy Chancellor

## **Conduct of the ballot**

- (5) (a) The ballot must be a secret ballot using the optional preferential system.
- (b) The Returning Officer must send or deliver a ballot paper to each member of Council.
  - (c) Following receipt of a written application, the Returning Officer may, on being satisfied that a ballot paper has been lost or destroyed, supply a duplicate ballot paper to the person to whom the lost or destroyed ballot paper was issued.
  - (d) The ballot must be conducted in accordance with the <u>By-law</u> clauses 17, 18, 19 and clauses 22 to 27 inclusive.
