

UTS Prize Conditions of Award Royal Botanic Gardens and Domain Trust Design Prize

Faculty: Design, Architecture Building (DAB)

This document sets out the conditions of award for the below prize ('Prize') and the obligations of recipients ('Recipient') and the University of Technology Sydney ('UTS') regarding this Prize. The administrative processes to support awarding this Prize will be managed, and may be amended, in accordance with UTS Rules, Policy and Procedures.

1. PRIZE NAME: Royal Botanic Gardens and Domain Trust Design Prize

2. PURPOSE

The Royal Botanic Gardens and Domain Trust Design Prize is to reward a design project responding to a brief in subject 11275 Architecture Design Studio 3.

3. VALUE AND BENEFIT

3.1 Number of Recipients:

- Up to six (6) Recipients will be awarded the prize in each calendar year in the following manner.
 - o First Place \$1000 prize
 - Second Place \$750 prize
 - o Third Place \$500 prize
 - Up to three (3) Honourable Mentions (certificate only)

3.2 Benefit/s to Recipient:

The award will be in the form of:

• A cash prize, the maximum total value is \$2,250 to the Recipient(s). The first place winner receiving \$1,000, followed by the second-place winner receiving a total of \$750, and the third place winner receiving \$500. The Benefit will be based on the Recipient's ranking as confirmed by the review panel.

3.3 Payment of benefit/s:

- The Recipient/s will receive one payment by electronic funds transfer to their nominated bank account.
- Where the Prize is awarded to a student team, the Prize amount will be divided equally amongst the team members, and each team member will receive their payment by electronic funds transfer to their nominated bank account.

4. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible for the Prize, a candidate must meet all the following criteria:

- Be enrolled in the:
 - 1. Bachelor of Design in Architecture (C1004); or
 - 2. Bachelor of Design in Architecture and Bachelor of Creative Intelligence & Innovation (C10325).
- Be enrolled in the following subject in the relevant academic year for which the award is made;
 - 1. Architecture Design Studio 3 (11275)

5. RECIPIENT SELECTION CRITERIA

• The Prize will be awarded to student/s demonstrating the most holistic merit, based on their final project brief in the Architecture Design Studio 3 subject (in the year for which the Prize is

awarded). This will be determined by the Review Panel, and is based on demonstrating the following learning outcomes:

- Response to the project brief within the disciplinary context
- o Quality of Work
- o Integration of innovation and sustainability practices in their final design

6. SELECTION

The Recipient(s) of the Prize will be determined by the Review Panel for the Architecture Design Studio 3 final project. Determination of the Prize will be made using the e selection criteria in clause 5. The recipients endorsed by the Project Presentation Panel will be approved by the Dean of the Faculty of Design, Architecture and Building (or their nominee).

- The Recipient(s) determined by the panel will be identified by the School of Architecture, or Faculty of Design, Architecture and Building
- These Recipient(s) will be presented to the relevant Course Director or Subject Coordinator/Lecturer who will confirm the Recipient based on the selection criteria in clause 5 evidenced by their presentation and any document submission as presented to the panel.
- Project Presentation Panel:
 A presentation panel will be convened. The panel will include the Subject Coordinator, another academic relevant to the course, up to three (3) representatives from the Donor, and students from the same cohort.
