

Q&A

1. Are students expected to upload documents in support of their EE applications for example a reference?

It is not required. If they wish for references to be considered, they can apply for SRS via UAC (EEP doesn't consider SRS).

2. Should students leave their early entry preference in their UAC list after they receive their conditional offer?

They don't need to, UAC and EEP are different application portals, they can have different preferences.

3. Is the closing date the last day they can change their pref?

Yes

4. Can students defer offers?

Yes they can defer offers. But once they can action this by themselves once. If they defer and then want to accept or vice versa they'll need to submit a ticket via AskUTS

5. Can they accept the offer and decline later?

They can accept and withdraw later if they don't want to study

6. To confirm, Yr 11 NSW students do not need to upload their Yr 11 reports as UTS is able to see these via NESAS??

If you are a NSW/ACT student studying the HSC, you won't need to upload any documents. By providing your NESAS number in your application, it'll allow UTS to access your Year 11 results automatically.

7. Would you know what grades UTS is looking for in each Yr 11 subject to get an offer? Is there criteria??

UAC assesses Y11 results and converts this into a rank (not published).

Each course that is available through the Early Entry Program has a threshold rank. The course threshold rank is determined by supply and demand. So, if there is high demand (i.e. applications) for a course and limited supply of places, the course threshold rank will be higher in comparison to courses that might have larger supply of places. Your Year 11 results are converted into a rank which is assessed against the course threshold rank.

8. Should IB students upload their semester 1 and 2 reports or just the final semester 2 report?

Students should upload everything (sem 1, sem 2 and final reports)

9. Are best 10 units considered or 12?

Students will be considered on 10 units, with the only mandatory subject involved in this being English. So functionally, it's English and their next 8 best units.

10. Can International students apply?

On-shore International Year 12 Students can yes!

As long as they fall under the eligibility of any of these;

- Student Visa
- Temporary Resident Visa
- Australia Bridging Visa
- Temporary Protection Visa
