

UTS Prize Conditions of Award Health Dean's Prize

Faculty of Health

This document sets out the conditions of award for the below prize ('Prize') and the obligations of recipients ('Recipient') and UTS in regards to this Prize. The administrative processes to support awarding this Prize will be managed, and may be amended, in accordance with UTS Rules, Policy and Procedures.

1. PRIZE NAME: Health Dean's Prize

2. PURPOSE

To recognise high performing students in their first year of a Faculty of Health undergraduate degree.

3. VALUE AND BENEFIT

3.1 Number of Recipients:

Up to four (4) Recipients will be awarded the Prize each year. One (1) Recipient from each of the following disciplines will be awarded the Prize:

- Nursing
 - C10122 Bachelor of Nursing (standard program, accelerated degrees are not included)
 - C10123 Bachelor of Nursing Bachelor of Arts in International Studies
 - o C10351 Bachelor of Nursing Bachelor of Creative Intelligence and Innovation
- Midwifery
 - C10225 Bachelor of Midwifery
 - o C10329 Bachelor of Midwifery Bachelor of Creative Intelligence and Innovation
- Health Studies
 - o C10360 Bachelor of Health Science
 - o C10396 Bachelor of Health Science Bachelor of International Studies
- Sport and Exercise
 - o C10300 Bachelor of Sport and Exercise Science
 - o C10302 Bachelor of Sport and Exercise Science Bachelor of Arts in International Studies
 - C10328 Bachelor of Sport and Exercise Science Bachelor of Creative Intelligence and Innovation
 - o C10301 Bachelor of Sport and Exercise Management
 - o C10303 Bachelor of Sport and Exercise Management Bachelor of Arts in International Studies

3.2 Benefit/s to Recipient:

The value of the Prize to each Recipient is \$2,500.

3.3 Payment of benefit/s:

- Each Recipient will receive one payment of \$2,500.00 by electronic funds transfer to his/her nominated bank account.
- Payment will usually be made within four weeks after the Faculty of Health prize-giving event.
- A certificate of award will be presented to the Recipient at the Faculty of Health prize-giving event.

4. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible for the Prize, Recipients must meet all of the following criteria:

- Be enrolled in an Faculty of Health undergraduate degree listed at clause 3.1 at the time of selection; and
- Be enrolled full-time in second year subjects at the time of selection; and
- Completed their first year as full-time load (8 subjects). These subjects must be from the student's standard Faculty of Health degree. Subjects from the Bachelor of Arts in International Studies and Bachelor of Creative Intelligence and Innovation are not included.

5. RECIPIENT SELECTION CRITERIA, IN PRIORITY ORDER

- The Prize will be awarded to the student who has received the highest weighted average mark (WAM) in their first year of study in each of the four disciplines listed at Clause 3.1.
- Where more than one (1) student achieves the same WAM, the student with the highest overall Grade Point Average (GPA) in their discipline will be awarded the Prize. In the event that this is also identical, the WAM from the previous session will be used as the deciding factor.

6. SELECTION

- Recipients will be selected by the Faculty of Health by confirming the highest weighted average mark (WAM) and overall grade point average (GPA).
- The highest WAM and GPA is obtained from the Faculty of Health Academic Programs Office.
- Selection will be made after the Autumn Census date in the Recipient's second year of study.
- The Recipient(s) will be approved by the Dean, Faculty of Health.
