An Academic (Indigenous Academic Development Program) works up to 2 days per week on an academic or professional paid contract and can be expected to engage in:

- mentoring and working with other Indigenous students in Jumbunna, so as to contribute to Indigenous student success, retention, and completion rates
- tutoring/lecturing in undergraduate courses
- research activities within Jumbunna or a UTS Faculty or
- researching aligned to the student's professional interests, where relevant.

What are the entry requirements?

Ideally, the HDR / postgraduate student will need to have passed the 'Stage 1 Milestone – Confirmation of Candidature' to be eligible for an appointment as an Academic (Indigenous Academic Development). The aim is that the HDR / postgraduate student will work up to a 0.4 (2 days per week) full-time equivalent (FTE) academic or professional contract for the duration of their PhD or Masters by Research or other postgraduate degree by Coursework and which includes research.

An Academic applying to be employed through the Indigenous Academic Development Program is considered on the basis of their current study results and the potential to benefit from this opportunity.

In order to be considered for this opportunity you need to complete an Expression of Interest found at the address below. This will ask you for various items of information including:

- Details of your postgraduate degree and area of research
- Your Resume that includes education attained; awards; research publications (if applicable); professional/industry experience; and grants applied for (if applicable)
- Information about your future employment aspirations

Current research students who apply to be an Academic through the Indigenous Academic Development Program are also required to provide their:

- Research description (150-word overview)
