

UTS Prize Conditions of Award

Health Dean's Prizes

Faculty: Faculty of Health

This document sets out the conditions of award for the below prize ('Prize') and the obligations of recipients ('Recipient') and UTS in regards to this Prize. The administrative processes to support awarding this Prize will be managed, and may be amended, in accordance with UTS Rules, Policy and Procedures.

1. PRIZE TITLE/NAME Health Dean's Prizes

2. PURPOSE

To recognise high performing first year students enrolled in an undergraduate UTS Health degree.

3. VALUE AND BENEFIT

3.1 Number of Recipients: Four (4) Recipients will be awarded the Prize each calendar year. One (1) Recipient from each of the following UTS Health undergraduate disciplines will be awarded the Prize:

3.2 Benefit/s to Recipient:

The value of the Prize to each Recipient is \$2,500.00.

3.3 Payment of benefit/s:

- Each Recipient will receive one payment of \$2,500.00 by electronic funds transfer to his/her nominated bank account.
- Payment will usually be made within four weeks after the Faculty of Health prize-giving event.
- A certificate of award will be presented to the Recipient at the Faculty of Health prize-giving event.

4. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible for the Prize, each recipient must meet all of the following criteria:

- Enrolled in an undergraduate UTS Health degree listed at clause 3.1 at the time of selection; and
- Completed their first year subjects (8 subjects) as full-time load. These subjects must be from the student's standard UTS Health degree, subjects from the Bachelor of Arts in International Studies and Bachelor of Creative Intelligence and Innovation are not included.

5. RECIPIENT SELECTION CRITERIA, IN PRIORITY ORDER

- One (1) Recipient from each of the following UTS Health undergraduate disciplines will be awarded the Prize: Nursing, Midwifery, Health Studies & Sport and Exercise. Eligible degrees are listed at clause 3.1.
- The Prize will be awarded to the student who has received the highest weighted average mark (WAM) in each of the four disciplines listed at Clause 3.1.
- Where more than one (1) student achieves the same WAM, the student with the highest overall Grade Point Average (GPA) in their discipline will be awarded the Prize.

6. SELECTION

- The Prize Recipients will be selected by the Faculty of Health.
- No selection committee is required to confirm the highest weighted average mark (WAM) and overall GPA.
- The highest WAM and GPA is obtained from the Faculty of Health Academic Programs Office.
- Selection will be made after the Autumn Census date in the Recipient's second year of study.
- The Recipient(s) will be approved by the Dean of the Faculty of Health.
