

UTS Prize Conditions of Award

Diabetes NSW High Achiever Prize

Faculty of Health

This document sets out the conditions of award for the below prize ('Prize') and the obligations of recipients ('Recipient') and UTS in regards to this Prize. The administrative processes to support awarding this Prize will be managed, and may be amended, in accordance with UTS Rules, Policy and Procedures.

1. PRIZE TITLE/NAME: Diabetes NSW High Achiever Prize

2. PURPOSE:

- To recognise and encourage academic excellence in graduates of the UTS Graduate Certificate in Diabetes Education and Management.

3. VALUE AND BENEFIT

3.1 Number of Recipients:

- One (1) Recipient will be awarded the Prize each calendar year.

3.2 Benefit/s to Recipient:

- The Recipient will receive \$500.

3.3 Payment of benefit/s:

- The Recipient will receive one payment of \$500 by electronic funds transfer to his/her nominated bank account.
- A certificate of award will be presented to the Recipient at the Faculty of Health prize-giving event.

4. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- The Recipient must complete the final semester of UTS Graduate Certificate in Diabetes Education and Management C11115 in the year immediately prior to the selection of the Prize.
- The four (4) subjects that comprise the UTS Graduate Certificate in Diabetes Education and Management C11115 must be undertaken at UTS.
- The Recipient must reside in New South Wales, Australia.

5. RECIPIENT SELECTION CRITERIA, IN PRIORITY ORDER

- The Prize will be awarded to the student who has received the highest weighted average mark (WAM) in all four (4) subjects that comprise the UTS Graduate Certificate in Diabetes Education and Management.
- Where more than one (1) student achieves the same WAM, the student with the highest overall Grade Point Average (GPA) in their course will be awarded the Prize.

6. SELECTION

- The Prize Recipient will be selected by the Faculty of Health.

7. OTHER CONDITIONS

- None
