



UTS Prize Conditions of Award

Pharmaceutical Society of Australia Prize for Excellence in Pharmacy

Graduate School of Health

This document sets out the conditions of award for the below prize ('Prize') and the obligations of recipients ('Recipient') and UTS in regards to this Prize. The administrative processes to support awarding this Prize will be managed, and may be amended, in accordance with UTS Rules, Policy and Procedures.

1. PRIZE NAME: Pharmaceutical Society of Australia Prize for Excellence in Pharmacy

2. PURPOSE

To recognise and encourage the achievements of high-performing UTS Master of Pharmacy students across all areas of study.

3. VALUE AND BENEFIT

3.1 Number of Recipients:

Two (2) Recipients will be awarded the Prize annually, one from each year level in the Master of Pharmacy.

3.2 Benefit to Recipient:

- Each recipient will receive a gift voucher to the value of \$1,000.
- Each Recipient will also receive a certificate of award.

3.3 Payment of benefit:

- Each recipient will receive a gift voucher for PSA products to the value of \$1,000.
- A certificate of award will be presented to each Recipient at the annual School of Pharmacy Gala Dinner.

4. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

The Recipients must be enrolled in the UTS Master of Pharmacy (Coursework).

5. RECIPIENT SELECTION CRITERIA

- The first year Prize will go to the student who has received the highest cumulative mark in all first year Master of Pharmacy (Coursework) subjects at the time of award of the Prize.
- In the event that two or more eligible students have the same highest final mark, the following criteria will be considered:
 - Highest overall GPA in first semester of the Master of Pharmacy course
 - Overall academic performance in the student's award course, including whether the student has failed other subjects, received academic cautions or had a finding of misconduct made against them.
- The second year Prize will go to the student who has received the highest cumulative mark in all second year Master of Pharmacy (Coursework) subjects at the time of award of the Prize.

- In the event that two or more eligible students have the same highest final mark, the following criteria will be considered:
 - Highest overall GPA in first year of the Master of Pharmacy course
 - Overall academic performance in the student's award course, including whether the student has failed other subjects, received academic cautions or had a finding of misconduct made against them.

6. SELECTION

- The students with the highest cumulative mark will be selected by the Graduate School of Health. The selection will take place prior to the annual School of Pharmacy Gala Dinner.
- The endorsed Recipient will then be formally approved or declined by the Head, Graduate School of Health (or nominee) based upon the selection criteria in clause 5.
