

DURATION

- Master's Degree: 1.5 years full-time or 3 years part-time
- Graduate Diploma: 1 year full-time or 2 years part-time
- Graduate Certificate: 1 year part-time

ATTENDANCE MODE

Subjects are offered via on-campus study days and online learning. Selected subjects are offered fully online. Part-time study is usually undertaken at the rate of two subjects a session. The normal attendance per subject is three to four full days on campus spread over the session.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Qualifications: a UTS recognised bachelor's degree, or an equivalent or higher qualification, or other evidence of general and professional qualifications that demonstrates potential to pursue graduate studies.

Registration: current registration as a nurse, with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia.

Experience: a minimum of one year of post-registration clinical experience and evidence of current employment as a Registered Nurse. (Specialty only: In some cases, applicants must have concurrent employment in the specific specialty clinical area of study. Suitability for enrolment will be determined by the Course Coordinator.)

SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

Evidence of current registration as a Registered Nurse in Australia; CV (including details of roles performed in current and previous employment); Statement of service (from employer); Academic transcripts (may be required).

Overall IELTS: 6.5 overall with a writing score of 6.0 Commonwealth Supported Place: Limited CSP are available in the Master of Advanced Nursing. To receive a CSP offer - Places are limited and as such entry is competitive and assessment is based on grade point average and demonstrated clinical excellence/merit.

Embody the professional qualities appropriate to the scope of the role.


